

According to David Webb, founder and owner of Camp Orenda, the goal is to "provide a backcountry camping experience within a very comfortable environment." He went on to explain that "90 percent of our guests are from urban areas and don't necessarily have the equipment or desire to camp in the backcountry without some of life's amenities. Here, you can get out in the great outdoors and feel like you're roughing it, but in the meantime everything is being taken care of for you."

The Adirondack Park, or "Dacks," is a 6.1 million-acre expanse of wilderness. Larger than the state of Vermont, the largest park in the Lower 48, it's an evocative place that has inspired the musings of such figures as Henry David Thoreau and John Muir. Rippling mountains with giant faces of stone make for some of the most significant mountaineering terrain in the country. Gin-clear rivers coarse through the valleys, offering whitewater rafting opportunities on their roiling haystacks of rapids. Between the rapids, broad pools run thick with native trout. It's an outdoor enthusiast's paradise. You could explore the Adirondacks regularly for your entire life and not touch every corner.





he European Capital of Culture designation (two cities get the title annually) often spotlights a destination that has become an up-and-comer on its own merits in the last few years, which is certainly the case with this ancient port town on the Mediterranean. A vibrant ethnic melting pot, Marseille is also home to an increasing number of contemporary art and avant-garde performances. Exhibition spaces include the 2,000-seat Le Silo, a landmark granary that's been transformed into a theater; the Panorama, an ex-tobacco factory now home to modern installations; and J1, a hangar on the old port that will host a number of events. While in town, book into a stylish hotel like the four-bedroom Casa Honoré or the new cheap chic Mama Shelter Marseille. - Ondine Cohane

f the name Oliver North means anything to you, there's a good chance that Nicaragua doesn't jump to your mind when you think of a relaxing, high-end, spa-filled vacation. For the past 30 years, the country has been fighting its image as a land of guerrilla warfare and covert arms deals. At first, only travel writers took note; over the past several years, various publications have declared the country the next great destination. However, if the booming eco-lodge business is any indication, Nicaragua's moment might finally have arrived. In and around the coastal towns of San Juan del Sur and Maderas, new lodges like the Aqua Wellness Resort, the high-end (and soon-to-open) Mukul Resort and Jicaro Island Eco-Lodge are cropping up near old-time eco-lodges, like Morgan's Rock Hacienda and Eco-Lodge. The food scene is getting a high-end makeover as well, with top chefs opening restaurants. The most exciting ones - El Segundo, La Casserole, Ciudad Lounge and La Finca y El Mar - are proof that Nicaragua is becoming an impressive food destination in its own right. - Danielle Pergament

ccra, the capital of Ghana, has welcomed business travelers for years. Now tourists are streaming in, a byproduct of the fact that the country has Africa's fastest-growing economy and is also one of its safest destinations. The Mövenpick Ambassador Hotel (with poolside bar and waiters on roller skates) opened in 2011, and the Marriott Accra — the chain's first sub-Saharan offering — will feature a casino and upscale shopping when it opens in the spring. On Accra's packed beaches, you'll see everything from snake handlers to plantain peddlers. Head to the upscale neighborhood of Osu and hit the treehouse-inspired terrace at Buka for fine West African food. The best Ghanaian adventures start with a giant plate of tomato-smothered tilapia and banku — a fermented yeast paste tha't sastier than it sounds — washed down with local Star beer. — Karen Leigh

his tiny country in the Himalayas has become a model for sustainable travel with the number of visitors (and daily traveler fees they pay) calibrated to preserve the delicate balance between preservation and revenue. Tourism is far from discouraged, however; new projects are making the country more accessible. Drukair, the only airline that goes to the country, is now flying daily from Bangkok, New Delhi and Singapore; there are also plans to start domestic routes inside the country. Hotels, too, are helping to open up new territory. The Como group, which already has a luxury outpost in Paro, has just unveiled the Uma Punakha in Punakha. And the Gangtey Gompa Lodge, which opens in May, will be a new base from which to explore the lush national park of Phobjikha Valley, an eco-tourism hub and home to endangered black-necked cranes. Of course the main draws remain a network of exquisite monasteries and temples and untouched countryside — all in a country that puts happiness ahead of G.D.P. Just remember that you have to travel with a United States- or Bhutan-based outfitter; Bridge to Bhutan for example, is run by two brothers who studied in the United States and are now organizing trips back to their home country. - Ondine Cohane

magine that the Museum of Modern Art and the Metropolitan Museum in New York were partly closed for renovations for almost a decade — at the same time. That's basically what happened in Amsterdam, with the closings of the Stedelijk, the city's design and contemporary art museum, in 2004 and the Rijksmuseum in 2003. The Stedelijk finally reopened at the end of September with a new, sleek bathtub-like extension, and the Rijksmuseum will reopen in April with much fanfare after a complete redo by the Spanish architects Antonio Cruz and Antonio Ortiz. The Van Gogh Museum too, will reopen in May, after a much shorter renovation. The city will also be celebrating 400 years since the building of its iconic canal ring and the 125th birthday of the Concertgebouw, the city's concert hall, which will feature performances by Eva-Maria Westbroek and Bernard Haitink among others. To prepare for the wave of visitors, there are several new hotels, from the five-star Conservatorium, to an Andaz designed by the Amsterdam-based design star Marcel Wanders. If you're lucky, you might score the single suite at a hotel/restaurant/shopping /exhibition space named Droog, for the collective that designed it. — Gisela Williams

industry, but it's making a bid to be the state's cultural and culinary capital as well. The Houston Museum District is a formidable coterie of institutions that includes the Rothko Chapel, the Museum of African American Culture, which made its debut last February; and the Asia Society Texas Center, which opened in a stunning Yoshio Taniguchidesigned building in April. And last summer, the Houston Museum of Natural Science opened a 30,000-square-foot hall of paleontology in a new \$85 million wing. Meanwhile, the city's dining scene is also heating up, with three of the city's newest restaurants - Oxheart, Underbelly and Uchi - placing on national best-new-restaurant lists. - Ingrid K. Williams

he largest terrain expansion in North American skiing is under way just north of the border at Red Mountain Resort in Rossland, British Columbia. Long known for its steeps, tree-skiing and out-of-the-way location (it's a two-and-a-half-hour drive from Spokane) that leaves its lift mazes empty and led Skiing magazine last year to call it the "most underrated" resort, Red has embarked on a two-year project that will add nearly 1,000 acres on neighboring Grey Mountain. This winter a 10-dollar ride in a snowcat will haul skiers from Red to Grey to enjoy a few runs that have been cut as well as glade skiing. Next winter a new quad chair will access 22 new slopes around the conical peak. Suddenly Red's trail map will stretch as wide as Jackson Hole's inbounds terrain. With a new lodge and the first on-hill accommodations added in the last few years, this local legend is ready to step out into the spotlight. - Christopher Solomon

Singapore

Spot green shoots in a financial capital

s one of the world's richest nations and a capital of global finance, Singapore has been awash in green for decades. But lately the densely populated city-state is burnishing its credentials as another type of green center - the ecological kind. A study released in 2011 by The Economist magazine's Intelligence Unit and Siemens ranked Singapore as the greenest city in Asia, and this year the metropolis of glass and steel inaugurates two vast nature projects guaranteed to boost the green quotient further and to enhance the city's image as a destination for environmental tourism. Gardens by the Bay, an ambitious 250-acre nature reserve, won the building-of-the-year prize at the World Architecture Festival for its glassy, hill-like main building, which houses attractions like the Flower Dome and Cloud Forest. Not to be outdone, the new Marine Life Park is already touting itself as "the world's largest oceanarium." It features a huge water park with rides and an aquarium showcasing some 800 species of underwater life. - Seth Sherwood

12 Montenegro

A Balkan gem that's small, spectacular — and cheap.

t's been almost seven years since Montenegro peacefully parted ways with Serbia, long enough that Russian oligarchs and former Yugoslavs aren't the only ones in on this booming Balkan jewel. For better or worse, an iconic Communist-era hotel with bold red carpets is becoming a contemporary Hilton in Podgorica, the country's pint-size capital. On the Adriatic near Budva, a six-year renovation of Sveti Stefan resort, which includes a three-acre island with rooms set in repurposed 15th-century cottages, draws to a close in May with Aman Resorts opening 10 suites, a spa and restaurant on the island. About 16 miles and countless twinkling coves north in Tivat, the blingy Porto Montenegro will become more glamorous when Regent adds hotel rooms, suites and penthouses to its fashionable marina in 2014. Some 1.2 million international tourists came to Montenegro in 2011. That's double the population and an 11 percent leap over 2010, a rate that beat nearly every country in Europe. Still, the country remains affordable. Comfortable hotels go for \$75 a night or less. Heaping plates of cevapi sausages, tangy cheese and oily red peppers might set you back \$12 with wine and dessert. Imagine Dubrovnik before the cruise ships or Switzerland before the cable cars. Go before it becomes either. - Tim Neville





White Salmon River, Wash. A river runs free, for the first time in a century.

t's a white-water paddler's dream come true. A major dam removal in October to allow for fish passage means that the White Salmon River now runs all the way to the Columbia River, flowing freely from its glacial headwaters at Mount Adams for the first time in 100 years. Local outfitters like Wet Planet are expected to begin rafting and kayaking tours on the newly opened section of challenging Class IV rapids early this year. Conservationists are happy, too, as spawning chinook salmon and steelhead trout have already been spotted swimming upstream in the new habitat. — Bonnie Tsui

You won't build up any backcountry cred at these posh spots, but even the most hardcore need a little time off. Here are our favorite places to camp in style.

The phenomenon known as glamorous camping (a.k.a. "glamping") brings more than a little civilization to the edge of the wilderness. We're talking about 1,200-count Egyptian cotton sheets, world-class chefs, seriously seasoned outdoorspeople running the place, and showers (hot, of course) in wellappointed baths. You don't have to pack everything in and out. You don't actually have to bring much of anything-except your credit card.

To wit: August sees the opening of the exclusive, all-inclusive Creston Ranch at <u>Dunton Hot</u> Springs in southwest Colorado. It features a handful of 800-square-foot tents with decks and style to spare, not to mention superlative fly-fishing in the backyard, three delectable meals a day, and access to soaking pools at the resort. The nightly rate of \$1,400 for two puts this property well atop the list of the most expensive luxury camping spots in the United States. Here are a few more of our favorites.

1. Orenda, New York

Beside a babbling brook, in the middle of the pristine Adirondack Mountains, the 40-acre Orenda resort has canvas-sided cabins with one queen or two single beds, a wood-burning stove, and plenty of rustic charm. Meals are cooked over an open flame; dinner might include center-cut pork chops, arugula-and-radish salad, and fresh-baked pie. And the private outdoor shower is a work of cedar art, complete with a water tower. The wilderness is still right at hand, though: kayaking, hiking, rock climbing, and spelunking are just a few of the recreation options in the area. Rates: \$135 per adult per night.

2. Paws Up, Montana

The 37,000-acre, all-inclusive $\underline{Paws\ Up}$ resort near $\underline{Missoula}$ takes glamping to unforeseen heights. Here, some of the country's most luxurious camping is done alongside not only the Blackfoot River but also Lewis and Clark's famed Lookout Rock. The tents have spot-on Western styling, premium beds, and either a private bathroom in the bathhouse or a full ensuite bath with a slate shower and heated floor. Camping butlers light fires, make s'mores, and offer planning advice. Each camp also employs a chef who prepares dishes like smoked trout cakes or baby-back ribs with chipotle barbecue sauce. Check out Away.com's Paws Up Photo Gallery for a virtual tour. Rates: Starting at \$1,055 per tent per night for two adults.



Glamping

Roughing it in style at Camp Orenda

Ever wanted to step into a Gilded-Age camping photograph? You know the scene: fency folks reclining on the porch of an Adirondack platform tent, servants waiting off-frame to see to their every

You don't have to be a Vanderbilt to enjoy a little backwoods pampering. Upscale camping, or glamping, is having a pop-culture renaissance. And what's not to love? It's nature without the heavy lifting, sleeping under the stars without bruising your bottom on rocks and roots. Add a side of gournet grub and you've

got Camp Orenda, in Johnsburg.

The restful resort offers four woodstove-warmed tents scattered over three acres on the banks of Mill Creek. The largest den can sleep a family of four; a more romantic creekside bower houses a queen-size bed piled with throws.

The delight of this place is in the details: the smell of woodsmoke as you arrive, the crosscut timber that marks the path from your car, the handmade bridges over the bouldered brook. Each canvas tent is packed with touches both homey and handy, from candles and flowers to headlamps and Camelbaks. In the common area there's a heated plein-air shower and Adirondack chairs circling a fireplace, plus a metal-roofed outdoor kitchen with a hemlock-slab island and

It's all been a labor of love for 35-year-old backcountry guide David Webb, who crafted every rustic detail himself. The land—more than 40 acres in all—has been in Webb's family for a half-century; he and his brother, composer Chris Webb, spent childhood vacations along this creek, which once hosted traplines and mills. When Chris died of cancer in 2008, David decided he wanted to share their favorite spot with others.

Within the next couple of years he quit his construction-management job in New York City and began carving this cozy niche in the woods; Orenda opened July 2011. Webb is almost always a holler from his guests, and three employees help him keep up with cooking, guiding and maintenance.

Though visitors come to Orenda with varying degrees of wilderness experience, many are a bit green. Webb, a former National Outdoor Leadership School educator, shows newbies the basics of Leave No Trace, plus how to start a fire or maneuver a canoe. But his favorite clients are the real babes in the woods—the kids who come to tramp along the trails and catch minnows in the stream. "I want to share with them what I experienced growing up," he says.

There are two miles of paths around the property—one leads to an old maple stand and syrup works—for families to roam while learning about local history, wildlife and plants. Tots to teens can pick bernies, go geocaching, shoot archery

Webb has a "choose your own adventure" policy: he customizes stays for each visitor, from Camping 101 to hard-core backcountry survival, from canoeing on the calm waters of Gamet Lake to spelunking in nearby caves. "No two trips are

One popular excursion is 3,254-foot Crane Mountain, just down the road from Orenda, It's a moderate hour-and-a-half climb with a pretty pond near the summit-perfect for a post-hike swim.

After the day's exertions, and maybe a quick nap to recharge, guests can watch as Webb preps dinner A typical feast includes blue cheese-stuffed burgers with applewood-smoked bacon, a Southwestern potato salad and cremini mushroom caps piled high with Nettle Meadow goat cheese from Thuman—all cooked over the fire Every evening wraps up with do-it-yourself s'mores.

Webb is a self-taught chef, though he did work over an open flame at Radegast Hall, in New York City, for a summer. His ingredients are as local as possible, including veggies and herbs from the camp's kitchen garden and maple syrup from

It's as delicious as it sounds, especially served affresco with a congenial group of fellow campers. But for Webb that's





Kayak the Normanskill

Paddle left out of the small feeder creek and you'll drift lazily downstream sandwiched between two golf courses as the periodic *thwack* of golf balls joins the chorus of bird songs and occasional rooster crows (nobody tell Mayor Jennings ...) beyond the brushy banks.

Just be sure to turn back when you hit the community garden and dog park at the Stevens Farm about 3.5 miles downstream, or else face dangerous rapids and drops that await below the Delaware Avenue bridge on the creek's rapid decent toward the Hudson River.

Take the afternoon and enjoy some of the best, and least appreciated wilderness, Albany has to offer.

Go glamping

If you've never heard the term "glamping," Camp Orenda, an authentic Adirondack back country retreat in Johnsburg, gives you a pretty good idea of the trend of camping minus sleeping on the dirty ground, swatting bugs or eating beans out of a pan. Camp Orenda, mentioned as one of the top glamping spots in New York by Huffington Post and Investorplace.com, is open until Nov. 1. Cost is \$145 per person per night.

Swim in a lake

You can jump in the blue, clear water of a chlorinated pool, or you can head outdoors and make swimming more of an adventure. Explore the bike-hike trail

The paved trail runs almost continuously from Rotterdam Junction to the Corning Preserve in Albany, with on-road sections in the cities of Schenectady and Cohoes. It's better to jump and get it over with: The water here is cold — about 60 degrees — but clear and refreshing, once you catch your breath. It's also deep, about 60 feet, so you can jump in from anywhere, including the cliffs at the back, with no fear of hitting bottom.

It's not your average swimming spot. If you are a water lover, it's worth visiting at least once. (If you are curious, check it out on the Web. There's tons of stuff, including photos and videos of cliff divers. Worth seeing even if you never go.)





It is quiet in the forest. Even footsteps are hushed by thick moss. Through the canopy, long fingers of light slide over knobby roots, petite flowers and unruly ferns on the forest floor. We forget the subtleties of the smell of wildness until we breathe it in again—pine needles, dark soil, living wood, fallen leaves—smells our ancestors knew as home, touchstones of our origin. Past the tree line, a loon call echoes over open water. A trail winds down the mountainside and ends at a cold, deep lake.

This is the Adirondacks, the southern tip of the Precambrian Shield—solid rock that covers much of Canada and Greenland. At a billion years, it's among the oldest in the world. The mile-high dome of the mountain range is still rising a few millimeters every year, an ancient land stirring beneath our feet. David Webb channeled the grief of his brother's passing here—into the transformation of a 40-acre wilderness where, as kids, they ran wild. He then decided to share the place with others, opening it as a nature retreat. Webb named the outpost Camp Orenda, after the Iroquois word for a spiritual force that drives us toward greatness.

Prior to opening Orenda, Webb spent two years roughing it as a guide on the rugged peaks of New Zealand's south island. The experience was still fresh in his mind when he designed his Adirondack haven. If roughing it is one end of the camping spectrum, Webb ultimately decided to take Orenda to the opposite. Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, the psychology theory that humans are capable of fully opening ourselves to aesthetic, intellectual, or spiritual experience only after the basic needs of food, water, shelter and safety have been met, comes into play here. When the fireflies flash against a blue-tinted evening and old trees sway like sleepy grandmothers, Camp Orenda comes to life, meeting guests' every need and then some.

Smoke rises from the chimneys of Orenda's six canvas cabins nestled into the trees, each custom-built, but all with thick mattresses, fresh linen, and down comforters awaiting the return of tired hikers. There are cedar, open-air hot showers, a bathhouse, and three farm-to-table meals each day cooked over an open fire by Camp Orenda's chef. There are kayaks, canoes, archery, arts and crafts for kids, optional customized itineraries and guided nature hikes. There's even an on-site masseuse and yoga instructor. After all, it may be the wilderness, but it's only a four-hour drive from Manhattan.

There's something to be said for roughing it—heading for the mountains with your tent, sense of direction, change of clothes, and a few packets of noodles in your pack. But we've all had those moments when we just wish



the tent would pitch itself, the firewood were already gathered and lit and the noodles cooked (and much tastier)...so we could just lay back and stare at the stars. That's what Camp Orenda is for.







It's <u>Camp Orenada</u>, a family-owned 40-acre retreat of six customized tents, an open-air kitchen, and a campfire nestled in the pristine lake region of the rugged and downright cinematic Adirondack Mountains. Activities take full advantage of the expansive surroundings -there's kayaking, canoeing, swimming and archery, among others. A full compliment of offsite excursions (think: rock climbing, horseback riding, mountain biking and whitewater rafting) allow you to further experience the pine-needled countryside. 
Coming here may make you feel like you've traveled to the edge of the earth, and, in some ways, you have. 



2. Glamping: Live With Nature, in Comfort

With roots in nomadic yurts and gypsy caravans, "glamping" is basically camping without the gear, hassle, and aching back from sleeping on the ground. In recent years, the term has become a popular catchall covering eventhing from tricked-out tree houses to carries tent camps.

WHERE TO FIND Grown-ups who pine for their summer camp days gravitate to Orenda (\$150 per person), a collection of safari-like tents in the Adirondacks backcountry where guests like, cance, and ride horses by day, and sip cockdaild around a fire by night. Dinner is served family style and cooked over an open-flame, but forget franks and beans—we're talking herb-crusted chicken and beat salad with pine nuts.

Somewhere between a tree house and a wooden boat, Free Spirit Spheres (from \$155) are suspended in Vancouver Island's coastal rain forest with little to distract their inhabitants besides the neighboring cedars, spruce, and balsam fir trees. The effect verges on the spiritual, says founder and builder Tom Chuddiejh: "We've become disconnected. A sphere speaks to unity with each other and the trees." For an experience rooted in fluxry—with a price tag above the clouds—there's Montana's new Cliffside camp at Resort at Paws Up, overtooking the Blackfoot River, made famous in the film A River Runs Through. It Guests enjoy heated bathroom floors, meals, and a butler. The grand total to steen in a tent's At least \$1,500. Guided this film is sortra.

BEST FOR Nature enthusiasts without the gear, time, or patience necessary to

CAVEAT Indoor plumbing isn't always de rigueur. Verify before booking if outhouses don't appeal.

TIP The glamping season is limited, so book early—Orenda's tents fill up in February.

3. Peer-to-Peer Lodging: Live With (Charming) Strangers

Struggling to make rent on their San Francisco loft in 2007, two friends invited some out-of-towners to crash in their living room to earn some extra cash. Fast-forward eight years, and their scheme, aka Airbab—estimated to be worth several billion dollars—has upended the hospitality trade, spawning countless compatitors.

Experts say there's more fueling the phenomenon than the prospect of saving a few bucks. "[Guests] feel connected to the community in a way that's more genuine," says Arun Sundararajan, a New York University business professor who studies the sharing economy. "You can ask a hotel concierge for local activities, but that always has a commercial shaen."

WHERE TO FIND Covering more than 34,000 cities, Airbnb's spectrum is astonishing—from pullout couches to historic castles and solar-paneled spaces like the Off-grid it-house in Ploneerstown, California. The digs on nightswapping.com, a cash-free exchange based on credits, range from an apartment guest room in Bangkok to a villa in Cardenas, Cuba.

Onefinestay.com lists only town houses in the most affluent zip codes of New York, Los Angeles, London, and Paris and stocks them with the sort of high-count linens, plush towels, and French-milled soaps you'd expect at the Four Seasons, as well as an iPhone loaded with host lips. The formula was a hit with Felicia Newberry, who spent a weekend at a SoHo apartment rented through the service. She likens the experience to taking the train instead of

BEST FOR Extroverts who crave a local link (choose rentals where the hosts are present) as well as introverts who steer clear of bed-and-breakfasts (search "entire place" when booking).

CAVEAT Booking typically requires more steps, such as verifying your identity.

4. Multigenerational Travel: Bring the Family, Not the Stress

A new crop of niche outfits offer rentals for multigenerational vacations, equipped with personalized amentiles and family essentials—whether guests need a high chair, a pediatrician, or restaurant recommendations for picky eaters.

WHERE TO FIND After traveling the world managing her husband's music career, Zole Kingsbery Coe noticed few holet froms with, say, childproof electrical outlets once her tots came along. That scarcity planted the seed for her family-focused online listing service, Kid & Coe, which launched in early 2013. Some 400 listed properties range from a two-bedroom pad in Tel Awir (\$180 a night) furnished with bunk beds and toys, to a sprawling villa in Barbados (\$2,285 a night) with a pool and optional babysitting service.

For families who need on-the-ground help, **Time & Place** is a vacation rental company with conclerge services that fall within the realm of a butler cum travel agent. D.C. attorney Channing Cooper booked a three-bedroom apartment in Paris's Le Marais to celebrate her 30th birthday with her parents and grandmother. She tapped the conclerge for everything from hard-to-get tables to French Open Lickets.

BEST FOR Those pressed for time but not money.

CAVEAT Overplanner? Skip the extra expense and go for a traditional beach house

TIP Reach out to the concierge as soon as you book, and provide as many details as possible.

5. Budget Stays: Reconsider the Hostel

Forget the seamy digs you knew as a broke backpacker in Southeast Asia. Young entrepreneurs have introduced a norfills model of shared rooms and baths in revisitied neighborhoods in cities such as Detroit, Cleveland, and Austin. Cleaner and pricier—though still cheaper than daily parking in big cities—many new-wave hostels have added private rooms and estras, including free Wi-Fi, towels, and storage, to appeal to a wider audience. Seasoned traveler Lyndsay Bouchals asys she prefers hostels: "I love the communal feel, the camaraderie, and that instantaneous connection you make with most everyone there." Collin Ballard, co-founder of Austin's Firehouse hostel, sums up the vibe. "A hostel is like a hotel, but the s stands for social."

WHERE TO FIND London-based hostel chain Generator relies on a formula of

steek design and free VV-FL with plans to expand to more cities this year. Nate at the Barcelona hostel range from \$1.2 for a dorn-skiple bet on an eye-poppin \$320 for a private penthouse. Opened in 2012, the Cleveland Hostel in the trendy Ohio City neighborhood has a shared kitchen, free towers, bike storage and a roof deck (from \$26 anight). Austin's Firehouse hostel sits above a cocktail bar in a 19th-century fire station and serves free breakfast (from \$29); and Pittsburgh's under-development Southside Traveler's Rest is near the Allegheny Passage, a prime locale for bicyclists starting or ending the trail.

BEST FOR Low-maintenance, adventurous types.

CAVEAT Light sleeper? Pack earplugs.

TIP Decode if a hostel is new breed or old dump by scanning the reviews at Hostelworld com.

6. All-Inclusive Resorts: Class Up Your Vacation

Once content to largely ignore local culture, more resorts are introducing activities designed to immerse guests in their surroundings. That is, when they're not immersing themselves in the infinity pools.

WHERE TO FIND Raising chickens and learning the two-step could be courses at a Texas community center, but they're also among the most popular offerings at Trawassa Experiential Resort in Austin, which opened in 2011 along with a resort in Hana, Maui (think ukulele lessons and lei-making). On the Riviera Maya, Barcelô Maya Caribe Resort guests can join a termazcel, a Maya sewat lodge ceremory in a circular stone but an herbal concection is poured over hot stones to create a purifying steam. On Mexico's Pacific coast, the Four Seasons Resort Punta Mita hosts a Huichol Indian sunset ritual, Spanish lessons, and lectures on cultural shores like mole sauce.

BEST FOR R & R lovers who like to learn a bit, too.

CAVEAT Don't expect to be a mole-making or two-stepping all-star when you get home. Deep dives into cultural heritage, these aren't.

TIP Check the fine print on what's included.

7. Hotel Gadgets: Tech Yourself Out

Mid-century Americans checked into hotels to give air-conditioning and color TV a whiri, before such appliances became household staples. Travelers still look to hotels to test-drive technology, and hotels hoping to appeal to digital natives are tripping over their discarded Ethernet cords to one-up each other with tech flash—from the cool to the curious.

WHERE TO FIND At San Francisco's Stanford Court, the Google Glass Explorer Package includes overnight accommodations and the use of the glasses, along







In a city as inexhaustibly diverse and adventure-filled as New York, it's easy to forget that there's a whole world just beyond the five boroughs. 

David Webb's Camp Orenda

When David Webb traded the discomfort of New Zealand's mountainous backcountry for the relative comfort of New York's Adirondack woods, he brought the trappings of civilization with him. He now runs Camp Orenda, an all-inclusive outdoor retreat that offers an immersive nature experience enhanced by stateof-the-art amenities and thoughtful design.

"It's a place for people who appreciate traditional camping, but logistically need something a little more modern," says Webb, 37. "My clients care about fresh linens."

The resort, which opened in 2012, is located in Johnsburg, New York, an hour from the Vermont border and four hours north of Manhattan. Although Webb isn't the first to jump on the upscale camping trend, there aren't many in the Northeast that offer a similar level of luxury.

Webb grew up in Bethlehem, New York, and his family has owned the Johnsburg property where his Camp sits for more than 50 years - he vacationed there as a child. In his twenties, Webb worked in construction on Manhattan skyscrapers and as a chef in Brooklyn restaurants, but traded city life for the outdoors in 2000 when he became a high-altitude mountain guide. He earned backcountry first responding certifications from Cornell University and in 2002, uprooted for New Zealand where he led tours from Christchurch to some of the island nation's highest summits

"It was romantic, but it was rough," he says. "Living out of a backpack was exhausting and I couldn't appreciate where we were most of the time because I was

so concerned with keeping our clients alive."

He moved back to New York in 2004 and rejoined the construction industry. In 2008, his only brother, Chris, was diagnosed with cancer. The pair took six months to travel together and wound up spending most of their time in the Adirondacks. Chris died later that year at the age of 35. "My family, who saw how much this place meant to me, suggested I turn it into a retreat and share it with others," says Webb.

Webb's initial vision for Orenda was bare bones. He wanted an authentic camping experience that mirrored the trips he and his brother would take as kids (i.e., no bathrooms, saunas or Perrier). But the demand wasn't there. Many of his client inquiries came from residents of New York City or Boston who didn't have camping gear on hand and wanted to bring their wives or families.

Today's Orenda is still woodsy, but hardly rough hewn. Webb designed a modern lodge for the main site that can be accessed from a dirt road. Around the grounds are five canvas cabins with wood burning stoves that serve as guest houses (he's adding a sixth and final cabin this year). To assist his head chef, he recently hired a full-time baker and two additional cooks. But don't mistake Orenda for a rustic Ritz Carlton – there isn't any electricity or propane in the main kitchen area, so all of the meals are cooked over an open wood flame and served family style. "Everybody eats together," he says. "Some of my fondest memories from my explorations off the grid are the dinners with people I'd meet on the the way."

Despite its indoor accommodations, Webb says it's the outdoor concierge service that separates Orenda from other east coast camping sites. Webb and his staff customize itineraries based on each guest's interest and skill level, including kayaking, horseback riding and hiking neighboring Crane Mountain. There is also an on-site yoga instructor and a masseuse.

Looking forward, Webb wants to expand into the Smoky Mountains or possibly Belize. He'd likely keep the brand name "Orenda," which is an Iroquois term for a spiritual force that brings about human accomplishment.

"The way I see it, not everyone is up for the bug-bites-and-all experience, and that's fine," Webb says. "It doesn't matter how people come back to nature, so long as they come back."

Surfers Lodge Peniche

The dream swells of the squally North Atlantic hit Portugal's serrated seaboard hard – and as the most westerly town of mainland Europe, they pound the surfer's paradise of Peniche hardest of all. Surfers Lodge Peniche, the newest bolt-hole on the block of the fishing village turned burgeoning resort, has just recently opened its doors to the latest campervan arrivals of wave-riders. And with its unique and nostalgic raison d'etre, it's aiming to shore up the most old-school surfers of them all

Run by former Swedish national surfing champ John Malmqvist, the "SLP's" high-end concept is to bring the retro finesse of 1960's surfing style back to life. As a result, the lodge vibe is more a heyday-homage to Californian counterculture than that of the mainstream modernism of Billabong branding and Jack Johnson on shuffle. Bedrooms and dorms here flit thematically from Woodstock to The Beatles and are all underpinned by the incomparable edge of Nordic design. Chunky bespoke furniture is crafted from the salvaged panels of old Portuguese fishing boats, while funky add-ins like denim jean ottomans and VW Kombi collectibles bring an Antiques Roadshow charm to the boho brief.

Beyond the design (and the dunes), Peniche's coastline is a Euro-utopia for all surfing levels, with the cove at Baleal (just a block from the lodge) an ideal stomping ground for rookies. The lodge's surf class options begin on terra firma however stance and balance are first practiced at a nearby skate park before BOSU balls are brought in for some pre-session core warm-ups on the beach. Due to its location (jutting out on a wind-whipped peninsula), Peniche offers surfers the best breaks in Portugal, and more advanced barrel-riders can graduate to Supertubos beach nearby, known for the best pipeline on the continent.

All classes are captured on GoPros, and, afterward, groups and instructors gather back in the lounge to analyze progress (cracking a Portuguese Salves beer, an optional extra). Come evening, the lodge's gournet bistro and Moroccan-style roof deck, with panoramic infinity pool, are already the town's it-spot for sundowners. West Coast spirit - Portuguese living.

So how does all that Scandi-style stack up against SLP's substance? Actually, pretty well. With no summer season under its wetsuit yet, nor barely a TripAdvisor review to its name, there's a sense that the lodge is going through an initial phase of character development. However, with a little more sand in its floorboards and a bit more amp to that Jefferson Airplane, Europe's surfing hideaway could soon be chalking Kelly Slater tens.

More information: Surfers Lodge Peniche is located about an hour's drive north of the capital in Lisbon, and offers surf-and-stay packages from €408 per week. The tenth round of this year's ASP World Championship Tour also rolls into the city on October 8-19, for those considering a fall getaway.

Voïdokiliá, Greece

As hordes of tourists pass through the chaos of Athens on their way to yet another well-traveled Greek isle, a nearly empty cove of towering volcanic rock cliffs and diamond-clear waters, surrounded by crumbling ancient and medieval ruins, is just a three-hour drive west. It's called Voidokiliá, meaning "ox belly," and for years this part of the Messinian coast was largely ignored by tourists because of a winding, poorly maintained road full of signless detours. When Greece hosted the Olympics in 2004, the road was fixed and the six-hour drive cut in half. Yet, even if locals favored it, the tourists still did not come. "There's nothing like it anywhere," says Lefteris Maniadakis, who runs the local surf shop. "You've got unbelievably blue water, white-sand dunes, cliffs, and 2,000-year-old ruins in every direction."

This stretch of the western Peloponnese coastline facing the Ionian Sea rivals the greatest in all the Mediterranean but lacks the cosmopolitan feel of Greece's resort towns – and the crowds. In Pylos, a small, whitewashed town about eight miles from Voïdokiliá beach, hotels are mostly family-run and cozy (if a bit weathered). The Karalis Beach Hotel has comfy rooms with balconies overlooking the harbor. By night, take a seat at one of the tavernas in the red-tiled courtyard of Pylos town square and join the old men in slacks and black caps for a candlelit dinner of octopus, carafes of red wine, and Greek salad made with Kalamata olives, named for the region's largest city. The only glimpse of luxury in the area is the vast Costa Navarino resort. It's all-inclusive and owns a stretch of coastline that has everything you could ever want, from surfing to snorkeling to spa treatments right on the beach.

If you're looking for something about Voïdokiliá that's more than sun and sand, an easy 15-minute hike south leads to Nestor's Cave, where in mythology ancient King Nestor was said to keep his oxen. It's a breathtaking four-story cavern in which, according to legend, Homer based scenes of *The Odyssey*. A steep climb up from the cave are the ruins of a 13th-century Frankish castle, whose walls plunge thousands of feet into a frothing shore break. A walkway along the sea-facing wall has no safety rails or guards to hold you back – the price you pay for having the whole castle to yourself.

More information: Fly to Athens – a good option is to take Turkish Airlines and stop over in Istanbul – and catch the bus to Pylos. Head to the Motorbike Shop and rent whatever isn't already taken. From there, it's a beautiful ride to the bay. Just remember to wear a helmet. Local drivers are aggressive.

Nigel Springthorpe's Vancouver

Nigel Springthorpe, co-owner of the bar Alibi Room and the recently opened Brassneck Brewery, made his way to Vancouver from a tiny town in North Yorkshire, England, at the age of 19 and has called the city home ever since. During that time, he's had a hand in the evolution of Mount Pleasant, a neighborhood just across the creek from the downtown peninsula that retains its historic working-class character. A century ago, the area was once known as "Brewery Creek" and it's just now regaining its reputation as a destination for drinkers and diners.

"No one's originally from Vancouver," says Springthorpe. "A lot of Europeans and English people go to a place like Vancouver and they're like, 'Where's the culture? There's no culture!' But, honestly, I find it exciting to be part of a place that's growing and growing quickly. It's a unique opportunity to be part of the thread of a city."

Springthorpe was a bartender at the Alibi Room before he and his sister-in-law had the opportunity to buy the place and transform it into a craft beer-focused neighborhood hot spot. The project was exciting both because Springthorpe liked running a business and because he really likes beer. He says that his new venture, Brassneck Brewery, which launched six months ago, started when the location at 2148 Main Street came open. He pounced.

"The location, with its foot traffic, allowed us to do the concept," he says. "We wanted to have a growler shop and a tasting room, but we didn't want to have to distribute in a traditional way with kegs and bottling."

Brassneck co-owner and brewmaster Conrad Gmoser, whom Springthorpe calls "the hardest-working brewmaster" he knows and the foundation of the brewery, works seven days a week to develop new beers and keep the tasting room busy. Gmoser has so far created 50 beers for Brassneck, with only two constantly available flagships (Passive Aggressive Pale Ale and Brassneck Ale). "We mess with the hops a little bit and tweak the recipes," says Springthorpe. "One of things I learned over the years at Alibi is that people enjoy choice. We like walking up to the bar and asking, what's new? We wanted to instill that kind of philosophy in the brewery."

Here's Springthorpe's Guide to the Mount Pleasant neighborhood. It may not be cutting edge, but it's fun and – for the boozy entrepreneur, it's home.

Coffee

Matchstick Coffee Roasters (639 E. 15th Ave.): "I go here three or four times a week."

Lunch

Nuba (146 E. 3rd Ave.): "This is Lebanese cuisine. You feel kind of health-ish when you eat here. I come here if I feel like I need some vegetables."

Sal y Limon (701 Kingsway St.): "A hole-in-the-wall Mexican place. They're not

rewriting culinary history or anything like that, but it's good regular spot."

Niahtlife

Pourhouse Restaurant (162 Water St., Gastown): "You need someplace to go when you get sick of your own place. Pourhouse is where I go if I want a nice dinner. They have really amazing cocktails, where you feel like all the molecules are fused together with attention and care, and they always have a different steak on the menu, which I like to get."

The Narrow Lounge (Main St. and 3rd Ave.). "This is a lesser known spot, just a couple blocks down from Brassneck. They don't have a sign, there's a little red light and if the light's on they're still serving. They don't have great cocktails or an extensive beer list or an amazing wine list or anything like that, it's just a good joint to hang out."

Guilt & Company (1 Alexander St., Gastown): "They have live music pretty much every night of the week, which is rare for Vancouver. It's a cavernous space in the basement of a heritage building, with local bands and a really great staff, keen on genuine, kind service."

Shop

Eugene Choo (3683 Main St., Mount Pleasant). "A Main Street institution that captures the Mount Pleasant look really well. They carry brands like Pendleton and Rogue Gallery."



Waimanalo Beach, HI

Lifeguards and peaceful water make this Oahu beach a safe swimming spot. "It doesn't have big waves there, so no shore breaks, no rip currents," Leatherman says. It's also a good place to get some local flavor. "A lot of native Hawaiians like to go there," Leatherman says. "But a lot of tourists don't seem to know about this area."

Explore the Canary Islands

The Canary Islands are to Europeans what Puerto Rico (and Vieques and Culebra) is to Americans, but the Spanish Archipelago is more than a German conga line thanks to the reinvención that is turning Lanzarote, the easternmost island, into an adventure destination. The 326-square-mile volcanic jewel, which bursts out of the Atlantic just 78 miles shy of Morocco and three hours from London, is suddenly attracting surf-chasing roadtrippers and road-racing surf swimmers.

Beyond the resorts surrounding the capital city of Arrecife, Lanzarote's modo de vida stick-shifts from package holiday to exotic retreat as the island's barren hills and bounteous farmland (think: aloe vera plantations) fold out. Winding upwards along the LZ-10 route, postcard white-washed hamlets like Teguise and Tabayesco are reached by dizzying drives winding up mountains and around hairpin turns. On the other side of the Ajache range, lies the island's lesser-known northern coast, where surfers tip-toe over jagged lava fields to catch the impressive reef breaks off Orzola and Famara beaches.

Timanfaya National Park is the island's main attraction volcano wise and its craters are filled with both native gallotia lizards and tour buses. Give it a miss and head to the Las Vegas de Tegoyo, a white-walled waystation in the middle of fields of flowers. A shortcut to the charming, church-centric town of Mancha Blanca on the blink-and-you'll-miss-it LZ-56 runs past several extinct volcanoes, all hemmed with spiralling balcony tracks, that absolutely beg to be hiked.

Surfing and hiking aside, tiny Lanzarote is also serious triathlon territory. Europe's most infamous ironman takes place on the island in May, so motorists can expect to mingle with pelotons thick with would-be contenders during the several-week build up. Join them if you can and then recover with some Canarian cuisine. The island's bodegas and tapas bars proudly dish out papas arrugadas. These "wrinkly potatoes" are boiled in local sea salt and are best demolished with dollops of the traditional and picante mojo sauce. ¿Cómo se dice "carbo-loading?"

Whether in the saddle or the driver's seat, visitors to Lanzarote can't help but notice the abundance of curious sculpture installations by the side of the road. These are tribute to César Manrique, a local artist-cum-activist who also championed Lanzarote's strict development limits. He's the reason volcanos still outnumber high rises and the locals will never stop thanking him for saving their island. You won't either.

More information. There are lengthy and expensive ferry services to the Canaries from mainland Spain, but Lanzarote is perhaps best reached from mainland Europe via Arrecife airport. Low-fares airline Ryanair flies from London, Paris, and Madrid to the island from \$70 return.

Extreme Adventures in Northern Ireland

Northern Ireland has recovered from years of violent political conflict, better known as "the Troubles," and emerged as a rugged travel destination for serious hikers, cyclists, and rock climbers. It's clear why. The region, set on the northeast corner of Ireland a ferry ride from Scotland, was carved by glaciers during the Ice Age and is now a mix of wide valleys, low mountains, and steep cliffs marking the North Channel coast.

With options that range from the classic (hiking, canoeing, cycling) to offbeat and pulse-racing (paragliding, rally racing, scaling sea cliffs), the hardest part about visiting can be choosing what to do.

"The terrain is diverse, from one of the most rugged coastlines in the world to mountains, caves, and lakes," says Padraic Woods, author of 30 Irish Adventures.

"And everything can be reached in a four- or five-hour drive."

RELATED: Visiting Northern Ireland's Dark Hedges

For downhill thrills, try mountainboarding in the Mourne Mountains. It's a cross between snowboarding and skateboarding, done on a wheeled board. The Irish championship course boasts a demanding dirt track – and grass slopes for beginners.

Northern Ireland's inland also hosts some of Europe's toughest rock-climbing routes. The epicenter is the Mourne Mountains, featuring granite outcrops and more than 1,000 graded routes. "All of the crags have character," says Trevor Fisher, instructor at Tollymore Mountain Centre, which offers weekend courses that begin on climbing walls before heading into the mountains. For bragging rights, attempt Buzzard's Roost, host of the notorious Divided Years, once the world's most difficult climb.

Where surf hits rock, you'll find the obscure sport of coasteering. Wearing wetsuits, flotation devices, and helmets, participants play in the 12-foot zone where land and sea battle it out. "It's liquid adventure," says John Keating, a guide at the Life Adventure Centre. "The rocks are trying to scrape you, and waves are trying to pull you off the rocks." Bouldering and cliff jumping add to the rush. Highlights near the Blue Quarry include leaping from a rock bridge into a sea cave.

RELATED: A Coasteering Adventure in Wales

On Northern Ireland's western border, you can also learn to maneuver a real armored tank, then crush a small car with it. Adventure Tours Northern Ireland lets you get behind the wheel of an ex-British Army FV432 tank – an eery echo of past violence – and navigate a rugged course. As for the car crushing: "Sometimes

the windows explode or the roof gets ripped off," says chief instructor Marcus Griffin.

More information: On the southeastern tip of the region in Castlewellan is Hillyard House, a small inn that serves local seafood and is close to Maginns, the town's most popular pub. In Derry, on the northwestern end of the region near Ireland, guests at Tower Hotel Derry can see where the Battle of the Bogside took place from the hotel gym.

Temple Reef

The Dive Masters at Temple Adventures Diving had everything they needed tanks, a compressor, and tourists looking to take a dip in the Bay of Bengal. The only thing they lacked was was their own reef, which is precisely what they built over the next five months by bringing trees and assorted architectural elements out into the bay. Five months after they began construction, Temple Reef is awash in shoals of fish.

Located off the coast of the former French colony of Pondicherry, Temple Reef has welcomed around 500 visitors. What they've seen is subtly remarkable. Frogfish camouflaged as rocks crawl across the sandy seafloor, carpets of silver garden eels retract at the first signs of danger, and schools of barracuda eye the finned congregants hungrily. A little more than twenty feet from the six-foot iron dome that serves as the new reef's hearst, angelfish swarm around a barnacle-encrusted scooter.

Temple Adventures Australian director Rob Partridge, got the idea for the reef from local fishermen, who traditionally create reefs by tossing trees into the water. The only problem with that strategy? "They biodegrade very quickly," Partridge saws. So he opted for something a bit more permanent.

The metal tower at the center of Temple Reef, assembled piecemeal underwater, was once a formwork for molding in-ground water storage tanks. Six tons of recycled concrete and rocks weigh down the structure and prevent trawling nets from ripping apart the reef. For now, it appears out of the blue like a ruin, but it's easy to see that it will be entirely obscured by sealife. At some point, everyone will likely forget how it even got there.

But the novelty of the ruins is part of the attraction that draws the few tourists in this corner of India onto a boat at the break of dawn and into the swirling depths.

Fishermen watch divers pass from their boats – more bound logs than actual vessels – and return around lunchtime. The journey ends with French cuisine and drinks at

2. Sleeping bags

Camping: Sleeping bags with air mattresses or other padding to separate your body from the ground.

Glamping: The king and queen beds are outfitted with 300-count linens at <u>Firelight Camps in Ithaca</u>, a glampground opened by Food Network star Emma Frisch and her husband Robert on the grounds of the La Tourelle Hotel near <u>Buttermilk Falls</u>.

3. Fire

Camping: Build your own fire, with pre-bought firewood or kindling you collected from the campground. Flashlights or lanterns are essential once the sun goes down.

Glamping: Staff spark the fire for you, so you can have more time to perfect your s'mores under the starry skies. At Camp Orenda in the Adirondacks, canvas cabins are outfitted with convenience outlets and interior lighting; WiFi is also available.

4. Cooking

Camping: Typical camping fare is cooked over the fire or on a grill. Non-perishables are a must, like canned baked beans.

Glamping: Gourmet fireside cooking at Camp Orenda includes "slow cooked pulled pork served on a fresh baked potato roll or Three Cheese Tortellini and Stuffed Crimini Mushrooms with local goat cheese." Staff will pack lunches for offsite activities.



5. Bathrooms

Camping: State parks are outfitted with public bathhouses; more primitive campers just find a nearby tree (and hope they packed two-ply toilet paper).

Glamping: Being in the back-country doesn't mean sacrificing modern conveniences. Camp Orenda boasts an "open air, naturally spring fed, fully heated shower house," with plush towels and Kiss My Face bath products. At Firelight Camps, the spa bath house is stocked with "everything you need to feel like you are not camping while camping."



6. Drinks

Camping: Bring your own beverages - canned, bottled or otherwise - but remember that campsites have a "carry in, carry out" policy.

Glamping: At <u>Firelight Camps</u>, a glass of wine is waiting for glampers at a complimentary "wine hour." The full bar includes a selection of wines, beers, spirits and non-alcoholic artisanal sodas from the region. Coffee is fresh brewed, not instant; a hot chocolate bar is offered in the autumn months.



I was raised in a camping family. I grew to love the closeness to nature, the proximity to hiking and fishing, and the ability to unplug from life's complexities. A fusion of glamor and camping, glamping has been popular in Europe and the western United States for years. Glamping properties vary, but at their core, they are full-service lodging options with fine cuisine, thick duvets, and fully featured sleeping quarters. Some glamping facilities house guests in tepees, others in treehouses. Semipermanent canvas tent cabins are another popular structure, inside which fresh flowers and plush throw rugs round out the luxurious atmosphere. This is what







Adirondackers might snicker at the term "glamping," but David Webb seems to be getting the last laugh.

The entrepreneur, who launched his version of glamorous camping in 2011, has captured the attention of The New York

In January, the Adirondack Mountains, and specifically Webb's Camp Orenda in Johnsburg, made the Sunday Travel section's "46 Places to Go in 2013," placing 21st between Ningxia, China, and Oslo, Norway.

"It's so exciting that everything I've put in here — the passion and hard work - and to see an industry that was pretty much non-existent three years ago, is now on the forefront," Webb said. "It was an honor for me to be written up and to be a part of getting the Adirondacks mentioned as a go-to destination."

Clients across the U.S. as well as Europe have already booked for the season at Orenda, he said.

Every weekend is filled until mid-September. Mid-week reservations are going quickly.

The growth of Orenda has been particularly gratifying for Webb. He has developed property his parents purchased nearly 40 years ago and where he and his brother, Christopher, spent happy times together as kids.

In a November 2011 story, Webb told The Post-Star he vowed to his then 35-year-old brother when he was battling a terminal illness that he would "do something" with the land.

He kept his promise.

Webb has built his own brand of glamorous camping: an all-inclusive authentic back-country experience with plenty of bells and whistles. At Orenda, there's no need to bring camping gear. Guests sleep on high-count cotton-clad mattresses in canvas tents heated by wood stoves and dine on freshly prepared "gourmet Americana" cuisine served with silverware and enamelware dishes.

Arrangements can be made for guided hikes, rafting and fishing trips and horseback rides, or visitors can shoot arrows at the archery range or hang back with a book in the outdoor pavilion that juts out over a rushing brook.

"it's important for me for people to understand they're not coming up to some random place. They're coming to an area in a private setting and getting all the amenities and access to some of the most beautiful locations such as Crane (Mountain), Garnet Lake, the Hudson River right around the corner, Mill Creek – Class A trout fishing," Webb said.

Although Webb has a total of 46 acres, Orenda's development sits mainly on two acres, with 2 1/2 miles of marked hiking trails.

The first structure, a pavilion, was built in 2009, followed by an outdoor kitchen and three canvas cabins. He welcomed guests for his "soft opening" in 2011 but considered last year his first official year in business.

At the close of the 2012 season, Webb said he already exceeded financial goals he had forecasted during his fifth year of business and now, thanks to the plug from The New York Times, Orenda is "off the charts."

In late April, a crew was readying Orenda for the first wave of guests arriving in a few weeks. Plans called for a fourth cabin, extensions of the pavilion and kitchen, and the construction of a 6- by 7-foot outdoor enclosed cedar shower with slate floor.

Webb is also replacing portable toilets with a bathhouse, adding personal touches like handmade soaps, installing Wi-Fi access to all cabins and partnering with more outdoor-adventure businesses to keep his visitors occupied.

Claudia Wheeler, owner of Wolf Pond Stables in Stony Creek, has worked with Webb since the camp opened and offers horseback riding instruction to small groups. She said her business has been positively impacted by Orenda.

"it's helped me out a great deal. I'd say it's doubled," she said.
"(Webb) usually gives me a heads up of who he's got scheduled for me and then I just plan accordingly."

Properties and chairman of the town's Planning Board, said

although he hasn't seen an increase in people wanting to buy property in Johnsburg, he believes Webb has given the area unprecedented exposure and is bringing people to the area who might not have visited otherwise.

"A lot of times when people think of camping ... they would rather stay in a hotel. They like to be outside during the day but at night they want to sleep in a nice bed, whereas Dave kind of bridges that very gray line between camping and being kind of pampered," Nester said.

Webb said he has "built out" Orenda and has no plans for any more construction, which he feels would detract from the rustic atmosphere and privacy of his guests.

He said he has little patience for businesses that profess to offer the glamping experience but do little to upgrade their offerings.

"Nobody is incorporating hospitality, food and beverage and guiding all into one small business," he said. "Instead, people say, 'I have a couple of yurts, let's do something."'

Looking into the future, Webb said he'd like to open another Orenda in the Adirondacks and is searching for property with a water feature. He's also scouring some of the more remote islands in the Caribbean and near Puerto Rico for an "island Orenda." Similar to what he has established in the Adirondacks, he'd like to build a resort that blends local history, culture and native food into the natural environment.

Christopher's ashes are spread over Orenda, reminding Webb of the pact he made with his brother. Asked what Christopher might think of the work that has gone into Orenda, Webb choked back tears.

"He'd be pretty amazed. He'd be impressed we put something together that is so in tune with the environment and gives people the chance to dial out," Webb said. "It's going to be a successful retreat for years and years to come."

If a rustic vacation by a cool Adirondack lake appeals, head to a camp or cottage compound in upstate New York, where you can fish, canoe or just sit on the shore and contemplate nature. Canvas tents at **Camp Orenda** (camporenda.com, 347-287-7359, \$190 for adults, \$100 for children per night) are outfitted with beds, linens and towels. Wood-burning stoves in each cabin come with stacked firewood. Three meals a day are provided by the staff, who cook by a campfire and pack lunches for daytime excursions. On-site activities include kayaking, archery, fishing, swimming, and arts and crafts for kids.

Plan a wine trail holiday

Follow New York State's Seneca Lake Wine Trail (senecalakewine.com), a series of more than 30 wineries, to discover the Northeast's largest wine-producing region. Or take a hike in Watkins Glen State Park, where you'll see some of the gorges and waterfalls the area is famous for. The SheQuaGa Falls, in the town of Watkins Glen, are lit up at hight and become a spectacular background for an evening stroll after dinner at the Blue Pointe Grill, in the deluxe Watkins Glen Harbor Hotel (watkinsglenharborhotel.com, 607-535-6116). The restaurant has one of the area's best local wine lists. For thoughtful pairings of wine and casual food, try the Red Newt Bistro, in the winery of the same name (rednewt.com). In addition to bigger hotels, lakeside cabins and motels such as the recently renovated Savannah House (savannahhousevacation.com, 607-243-7787, rooms start at \$159 a night through October) abound. Not every Wall Streeter is into spending their summer weekends with sand, surf, and New York City club transplants - i.e. The Hamptons.

For those who prefer a more rustic getaway, Camp Orenda in the Adirondacks has become a solid alternative.

Yes, there are gorgeous vistas like Crane Mountain, one of the few mountains in the eastern U.S. that has a natural large lake on top - a river, three-tiered

waterfall, and other examples of the upstate New York's natural beauty.

But the most important thing about Orenda that it's incredibly luxurious.

Think steaming hot showers, tents with gorgeous full beds, and farm-to-table anything (or gluten-free, or kosher, or whatever you need). The point was to create a camping experience for people who can't keep camping gear in their tiny NYC apartment - and that you never have to open your wallet once you get to camp.

Some call this concept "glamping" (glamour plus camping), though Orenda founder David Webb dislikes the term. It's a tradition that predates the term by a long time anyway.

"If there's ever a true founder of the glamping concept its those old style Robber Barons," said Webb. "They took pride in going into the back country and doing it in style and comfort."

Of course, the Robber Barons took about 150 servants with them, and Orenda does it with a staff of about five. They also probably didn't do yoga along with their kayaking, hiking, and archery.

Either way, it's working. Last year, The New York Times put Orenda on its 46 places to visit list, and since that time visits to the camp have shot up 300%.
